Songs of the alphabet and counting recitations ring out each afternoon in the Educational Resource Center in Kogoya Village. Funded by a grant from the Rodger A. Graef Foundation, and furnished by donations from a fund-raising event at Discovery Church in Carlsbad, California, the center is now in use each day. Targeting primarily those youngsters who have fallen significantly behind in their schooling, two credentialed teachers, Brian and Bertha, work during the afternoons to give extra educational support to these youngsters. Education is as critical in Malawi as it is here, and we hope that with this additional help, many of the children will be able to make important strides in their learning process.

Two times a week, after the children have cleared out of the facility, a steady stream of adults make their way to the center. Young mothers with babies tied to their backs, seasoned grandmothers, and the occasional man, expectantly come through the doors to learn the same things their children and grandchildren are learning in primary school. Brian and Bertha greet this excited "student-body" with paper, pencils, smiles, and encouragement. What a treasure God is providing for His grown-up children.
